Niigata Matsuri

A weekend-long festival to pray for the safety of the port and river and the prosperity of business and commerce. The big "Minyo Nagashi" Japanese folk dancing parade is open to everyone. On the last day there is also a huge firework display.

Sake Breweries

Niigata's environment, ideal for brewing sake, has given birth to many breweries. Each brewery has its own long tradition of carefully-honed techniques.

Niigata Shikki (Lacquerware)

Niigata Shikki is a treasure trove of unique styles and techniques, nicknamed kawari nuri, that experiment with unusual colors, patterns and textures. The charm of kawari nuri lies in the innovative style of objects designed to be used as tableware.

Kameda-jima

A fabric originally developed as a material for farmers' clothes which is famous for its striped pattern in traditional colors, its sturdiness and its soft texture.

Ramen

In Niigata, the “Ramen Kingdom,” ramen dishes such as “Niigata Light Ramen” and “Niigata Rich Miso Ramen” have long been particularly popular.

Tarekatsu-don

A type of katsu-don served only in Niigata, in which a big bowl of rice is topped with freshly-fried pork cutlets dipped in sweet soy sauce.

Japanese dish unique to Niigata Hegi Soba

A rare type of Japanese soba (buckwheat noodles) which uses seaweed as thickener, “hegi soba” is elegantly arranged on a big wooden tray called a “hegi” that is placed in the middle of the table to share.

Niigata Furusato Village Bazaar Hall

The first floor is a food hall where you can buy local produce, specialties, and souvenirs and the second floor is full of restaurants.

Iwamuro Onsen

The 300-year old Iwamuro Onsen, the only hot spring in Niigata City, is also known as “Reigan no Yu.” Reigan means “spirit of the wild goose.” and according to legend, the spring (yu) was discovered when an injured wild goose was healed by bathing in its waters.



The big bath and the outdoor bath are the largest in the area. This is the only hotel in Niigata with a stone sauna.

Places of Interest

These are some of the many tourist locations which can be easily reached from Niigata City. You are sure to enjoy the delights of these areas in all their rich variety.

Sado Island

An island with a rich historic heritage and great natural beauty, where traditions handed down from days of old can still be found. The island offers a wealth of different experiences, tours and other activities.



Sado Gold and Silver Mine

There is a lot to see in this historic landmark which tells you about the 400-year history of gold and silver mining on Sado. You can visit the remains of the mine shafts, some of which were manually-dug, and the places where the gold and silver were smelted and sorted.



Tarai Bune (tub boat)

The tarai bune was designed to catch abalone and other types of mollusks. The boats are still used for this purpose, but have expanded for tourists. Enjoy a leisurely trip in a tub on the water while the boat-woman steers and take a turn steering for yourself.

Tsubame-Sanjo

Tsubame focused mainly on *tsuiki* (hammered) copperware and western tableware. Sanjo prospered thanks to cutlery and other types of hardware. Under the name Tsubame-Sanjo, the area is world famous for its metal processing industries.



Gyokusen-do

Gyokusen-do is the name of an old copperware workshop and showroom, founded 200 years ago. It produces *tsuiki* or hammered copperware, a traditional metalworking technique in which copper objects are made by hammering single sheets of copper into shape. You can go on a guided tour of the workshop. The building itself is well worth seeing since it is a registered tangible cultural property.



Hocho-Kobo Tadafusa

Sanjo, famous as “the blacksmiths’ town,” enjoys an excellent reputation in Japan and worldwide for its metalworking industry. Tadafusa, founded seventy years ago, produces kitchen knives that are entirely handmade by craftsmen. Guided tours are offered but must be reserved beforehand.

Yahiko

The village of Yahiko, located in the foothills of Mount Yahiko, is full of charm all times of the year. Here you will find Yahiko Shrine, a place of mystical energy, a cable car offering magnificent views, and Yahiko Park, famous for its autumn leaves.



Yahiko Shrine

This is a much-loved shrine, affectionately known as “Oyahiko-sama.” The imposing shrine building, set against a background of luxuriant forest, expresses a solemn grandeur appropriate to the most important shrine in Niigata.



Yahiko Park

The park covers an area of 160,000m² near Yahiko Station. Visitors love the richly-varied scenery. In particular, the sight of the Kangetsukyo Bridge and the valley of maple trees in autumn when the leaves all turn red and gold is one to behold.

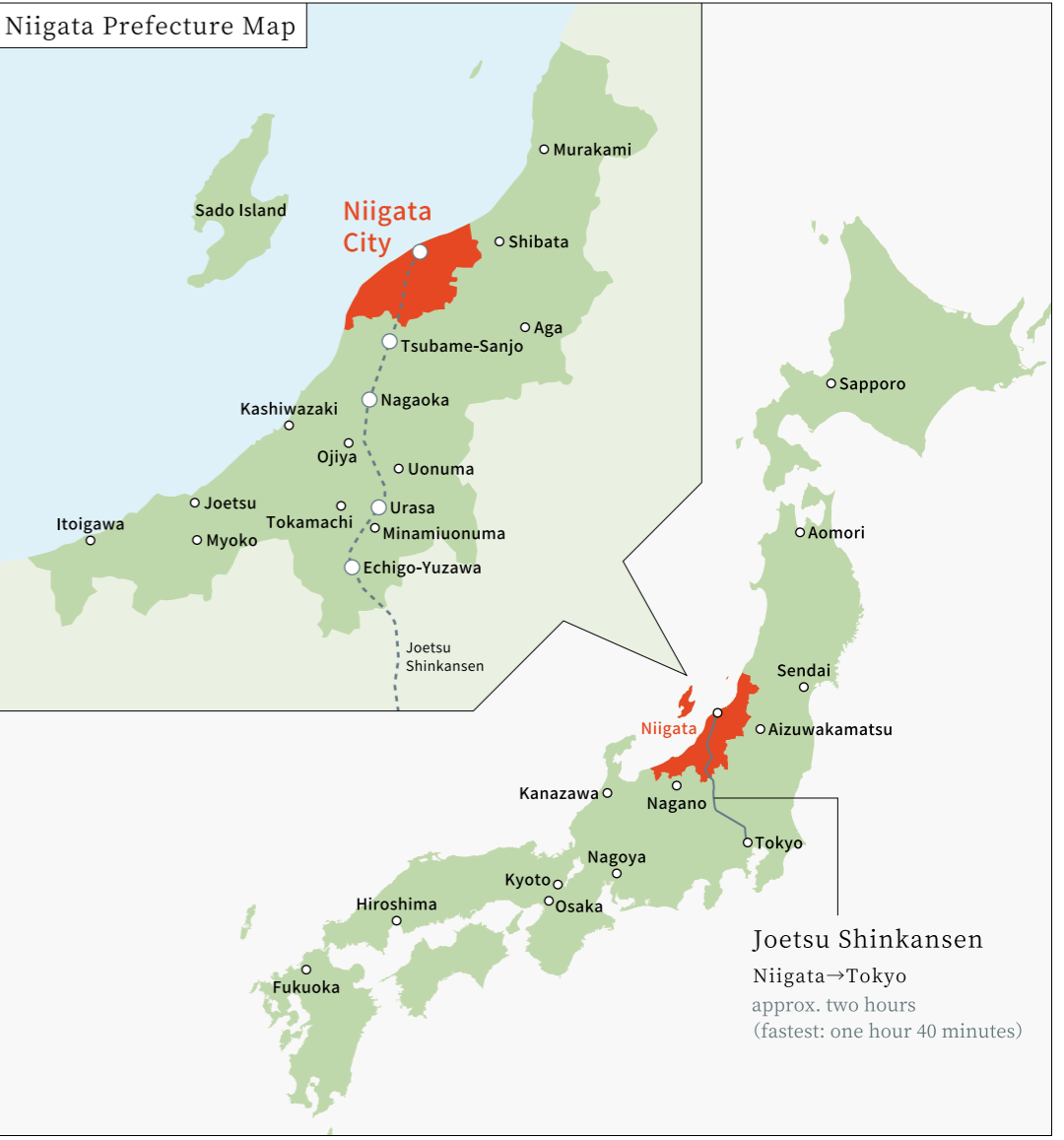
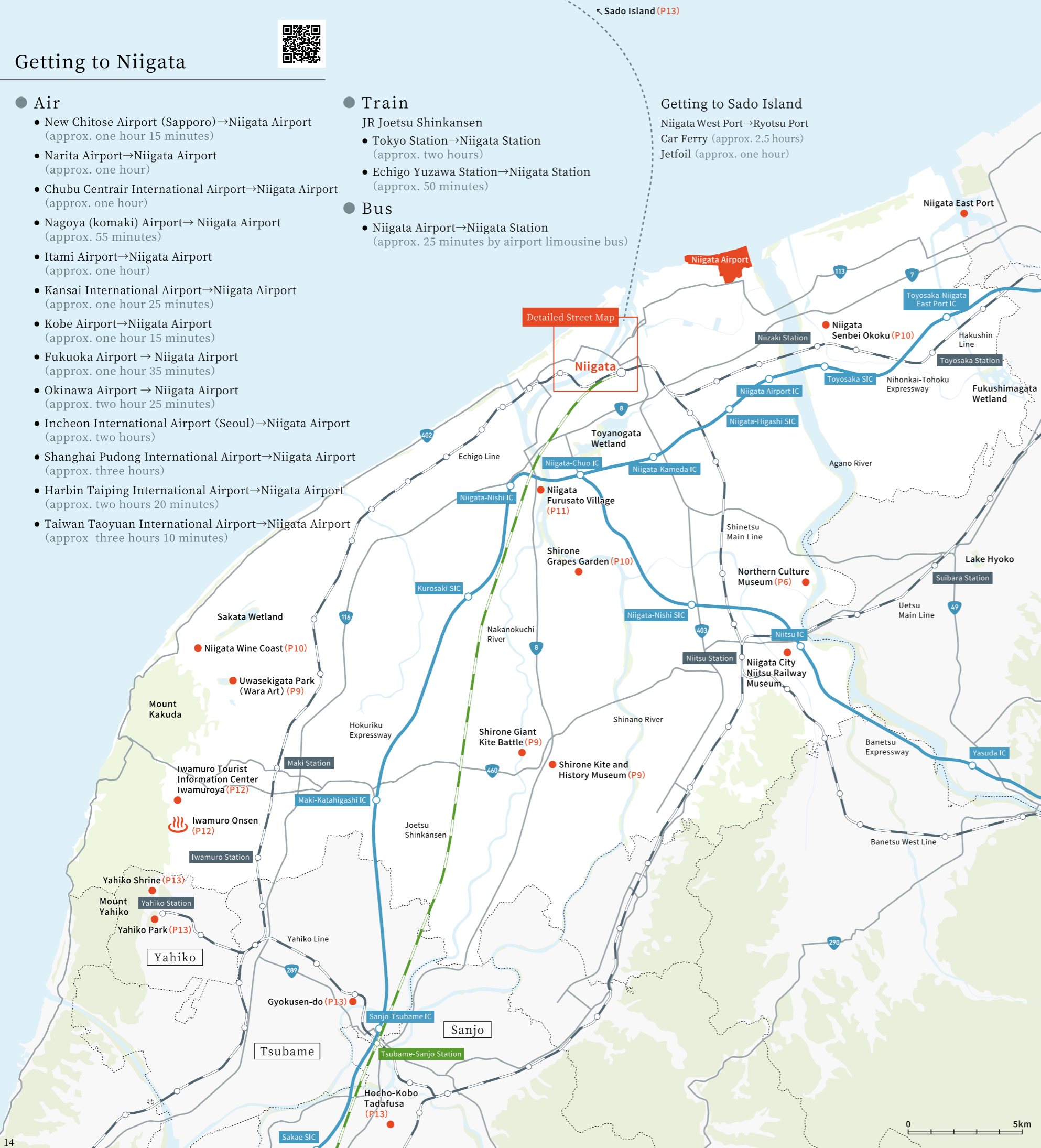
